Gentlemen:

Enclosed are Corrected Copies of two licenses for Virginia Baptist Hospital; 45-10542-01 (nuclear medicine except teletherapy) and 45-10542-02 (teletherapy). This was made necessary by our error in not including Dr. Hilliard in the July 5, 1995, amendment process. The process we are using has been modified since the April request, and we did not realize our error. No fee will be charged. It shall remain our policy to include the names of authorized users and nuclear pharmacists of whom we have been notified of the beginning of service in the next amending action or renewal.

We have included Dr. Hilliard on the teletherapy license, but we have listed her in the therapy areas on the nuclear medicine license, since her credentials do not reflect appropriate training for the diagnostic modes, as indicated by the requirements in SubPart J of Part 35, Title 10 Code of Federal Regulations. We understand that this is the case based upon a telephone conversation with Mr. V. McComas of your staff.

We have split the previous radiopharmaceutical uses into two items to allow for the handling and limitation of specific quantities of materials in a single package.

Thank you for bringing this to our attention. Please read the licenses carefully, as you have done before. Please call Mr. David J. Collins of our staff at (404) 331-5624, or fax at (404) 331-7437 should you have further questions. We have enclosed a copy of the recently revised NRC Enforcement Policy.

MATERIALS LICENSE

Amendment No. 3

Pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-438), and Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter I, Parts 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 39, 40, and 70, and in reliance on statements and representations heretofore made by the licensee, a license is hereby issued authorizing the licensee to receive, acquire, possess, and transfer byproduct, source, and special nuclear material designated below; to use such material for the purpose(s) and at the place(s) designated below, to deliver or transfer such material to persons authorized to receive it in accordance with the regulations of the applicable Part(s). This license shall be deemed to contain the conditions specified in Section 193 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and is subject to all applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission now or hereafter in effect and to any conditions specified below.

**CONDITIONS**

- 13. Licensed material shall be used by, or under the supervision of, the following individuals for the materials and uses specified:
  - A. Robert L. Driskill, M.D. Medical use identified in 10 CFR 35.600 and depleted uranium as shielding.
  - B. Anita Joy Hilliard, M.D. Medical use identified in 10 CFR 35.600 and depleted uranium as shielding.
- 14. Sealed sources containing licensed material shall not be opened or removed from the teletherapy device by the licensee.
- 15. The licensee is exempted from decommissioning financial assurance requirements for possession of licensed material in sealed sources in quantities greater than the limits in 10 CFR 30.35(d) for the purpose of source changes only. This exemption is granted for no more than 30 days for any one source change.
- 16. The licensee shall maintain records of information important to safe and effective decommissioning at the location specified in Condition 10. above pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 30.35(g) until this license is terminated by the Commission.
- 17. Except as specifically provided otherwise in this license, the licensee shall conduct its program in accordance with the statements, representations, and procedures contained in the documents, including any enclosures, listed below, except for minor changes in the medical use radiation safety procedures as provided in 10 CFR 35.31. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's regulations shall govern unless the statements, representations, and procedures in the licensee's application and correspondence are more restrictive than the regulations.
